12% of children <5 moderately or severely underweight in 2011 (47% ▲ since 2005/06)
- Reduce child mortality**
<5 mortality rate 24 per 1000 live births in 2013 (18% ▲ since 2005)
- Improve maternal health**
Maternal mortality ratio 49 per 100,000 live births in 2013 (18% ▲ since 2005)
Unmet need for family planning 4% in 2010/12 (no data since 2005/06)
- Combat HIV/AIDS, malaria and other diseases**
58% population with advanced HIV infection with access to ART in 2012 (52% ▲ since 2005)
Children <5 sleeping under insecticide-treated bednets 9% (4% ▼ since 2005)

Values of performance are considered satisfactory (presented in green) if equal to or above the regional average.

All data presented on the score card are self-reported by the Ministry of Health (MoH) or development partners (DP) supporting the country health sector. All DP data have, in principle, been validated by the MoH. CIA data (indicator 7) have been extracted from the World Bank.

FRONT PAGE
The 7 indicators in the left column present the government performance on development effectiveness in health. The right column presents the aggregate development partners' performance related to the comparable indicators. Performance is presented for 2010/11 (last monitoring round) and 2013; government performance is compared with the average performance of all 24 participating countries; aggregate DP performance is compared with the overall DP performance in the same 24 countries.

Rating symbols illustrate whether respectively the government and/or the development partners have achieved the target (▶), whether there is evidence of action (●) or no evidence of action (◻). Action is assessed by demonstrated evidence of work delivered against the indicator.

Data on health expenditure and progress on MDGs are provided for contextual purposes.

For each of the participating development partners, the performance in 2013 is rated against each of the 7 indicators. Data for 2010/11 are provided for comparison.

Performance is presented either as a YES/NO answer or as a percentage achievement above or below the target.

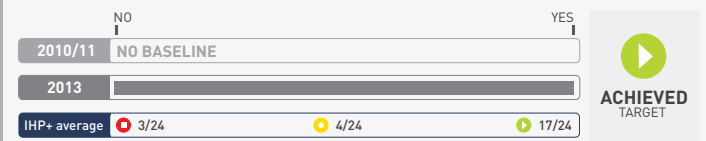

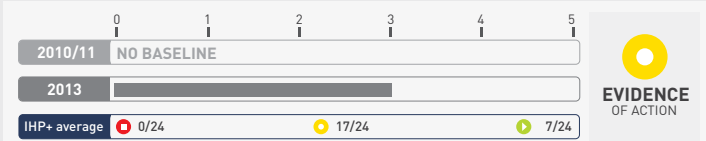

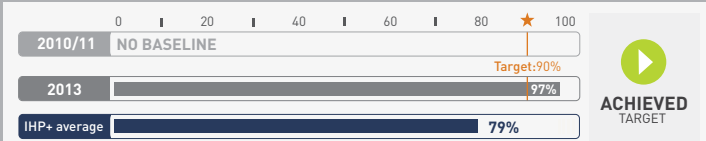

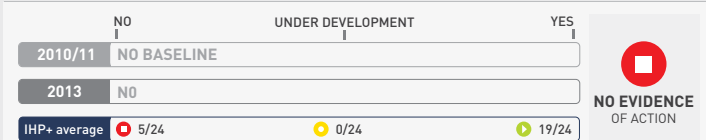
2. DOES GOVERNMENT SUPPORT MEANINGFUL PARTICIPATION OF CIVIL SOCIETY ORGANISATIONS?



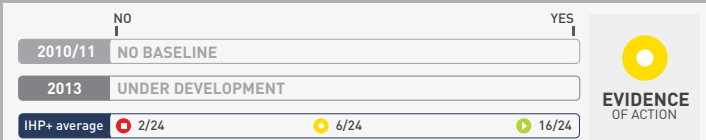
3A. ARE GOVERNMENT FUNDS DISBURSED PREDICTABLY?



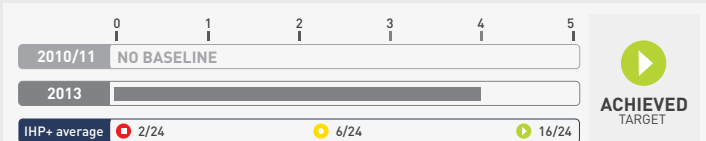
3B. ARE GOVERNMENT RESOURCES PLANNED OVER MORE THAN ONE YEAR?



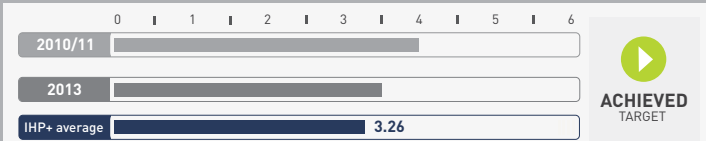

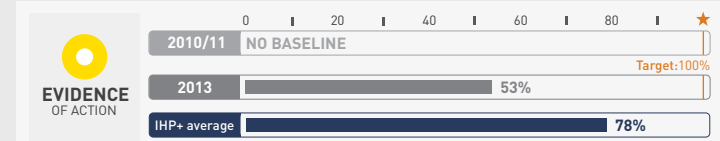

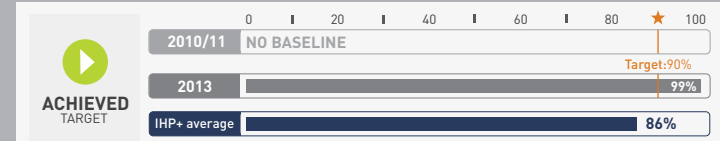

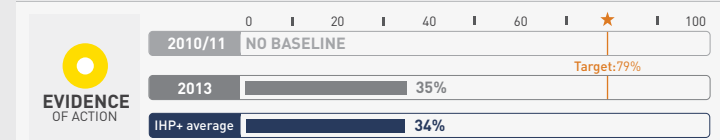

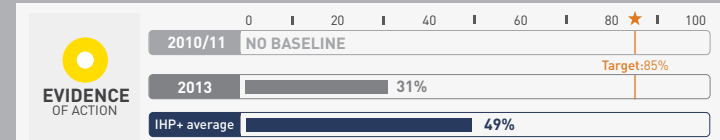

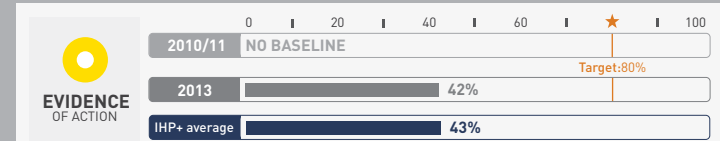

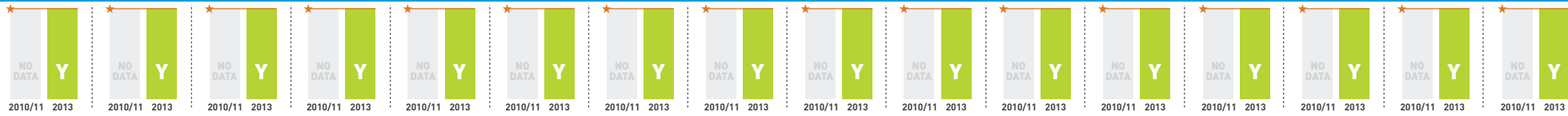

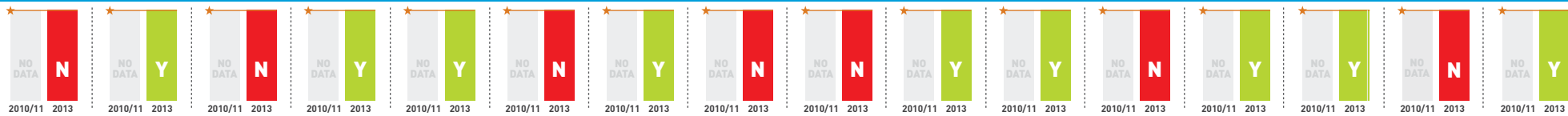

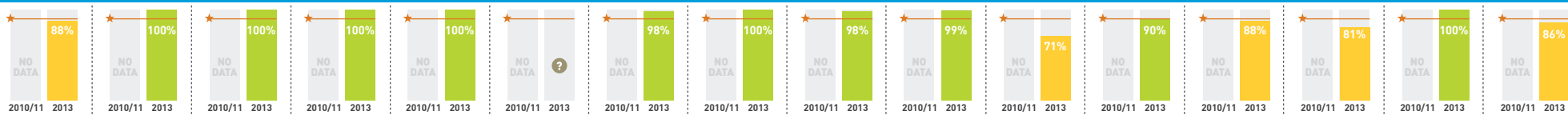

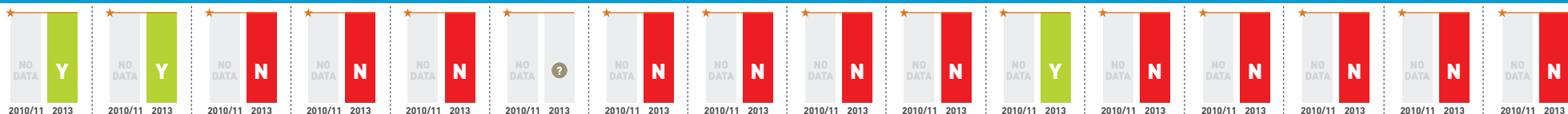

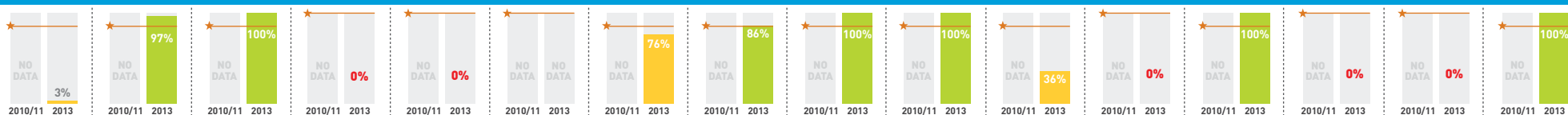
3B. DOES GOVERNMENT HAVE INFORMATION ON DP EXPENDITURE PLANS FOR THREE YEARS AHEAD?
