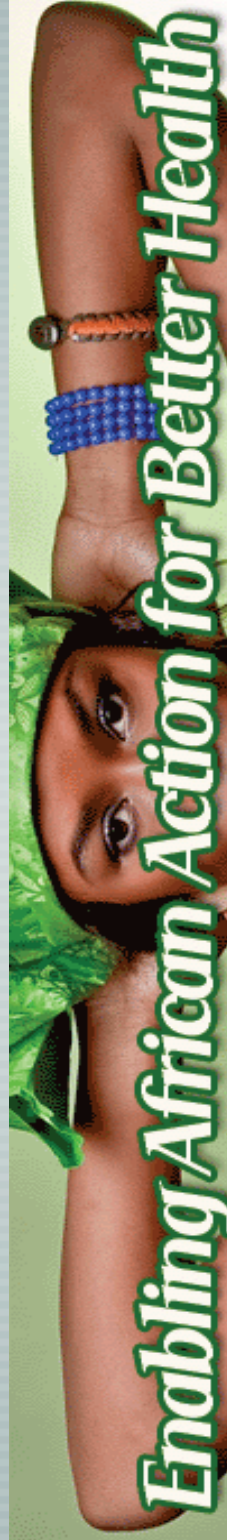




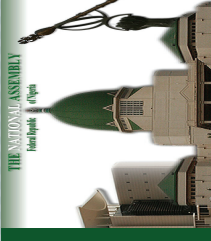

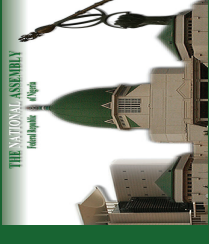


Access, Effectiveness, Results and Accountability:

- Triggers:
 - Accountability for resources indicated in IHP+ Nigeria Country Compact (domestic & international) and the National Health Sector Strategic Development Plan (NHSDP)
 - Making Parliament accountable for health budget provisions
 - Learn and adapt from global accountability process (IHP+ Results) and TTHATS (OECD)
 - Promoting Country Based Platform for Development Effectiveness and Accountability
 - Parliamentary Commissioned Study to CS: Tracking ODA and national budgets in key sectors and among the major partners

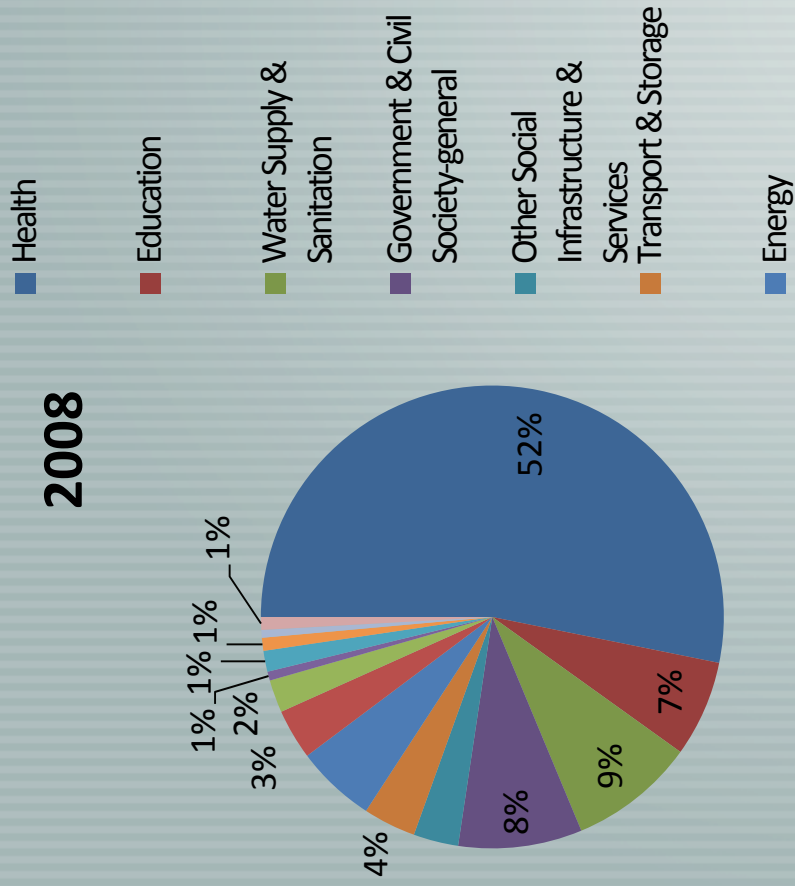

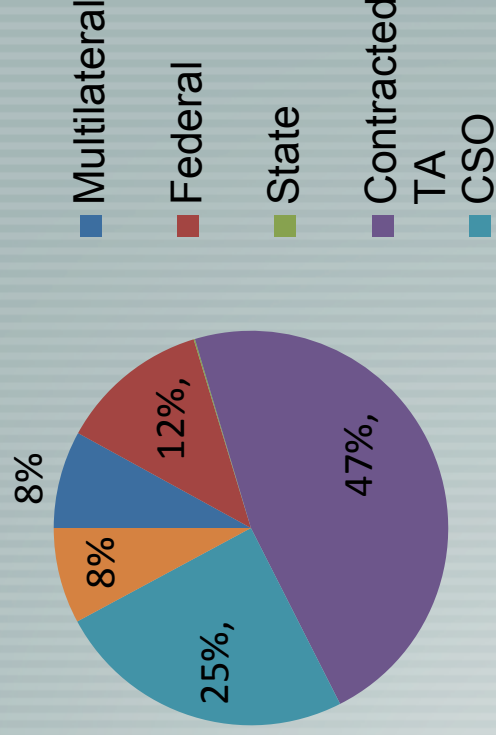
Majority of ODA goes to health:

A Joint Legislative Dialogue: Recommendations & Action



Proactive engagement of the National Assembly on aid effectiveness and accountability for both results and resources

Strengthen budget review and appropriation processes of Committees on Appropriations of the National Assembly

Establish the National Budget and Research Office as an Act of the National Assembly

Deepen dialogue and expand its Inclusive National Budgeting Initiative

Establish a Civil Society Fund on Aid Effectiveness, Results and Accountability to support the independent accountability function of civil society organizations

(Collaboration: Continental Networks, Programme Delegation, Boards and Consultative Fora)



An informal collaboration of institutions, coalitions and networks in the economic south

Established in 2010 with support from the IHP+, GHWA and the GAVI CS Forum

Grown in 3 years to 695 members: 39 networks and 641 individuals and 15 Southern CS representatives on delegations

Mission: Bring country context and amplify southern voices in country, regional and global health dialogue

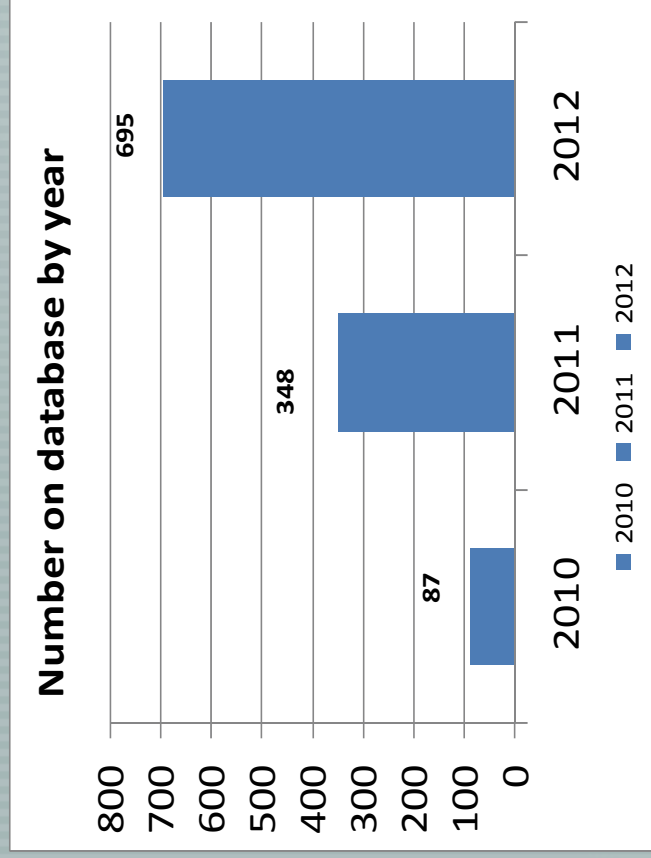

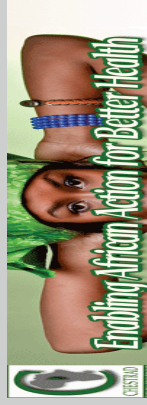
