

UHC2030 Private Sector Constituency – Membership Arrangements

As part of the UHC2030 Private Sector Constituency, your entity will be able to engage in the global dialogue on UHC and engage with UHC2030 and its partners on health system strengthening for UHC. The UHC2030 Private Sector Constituency has **two levels of membership**:

- **Consultative Group**
- **Core Action Group**

Consultative Group

Every entity that fulfils the criteria for membership of the constituency will automatically be part of the Consultative Group.

The Consultative Group will represent a broad range of private sector perspectives and contribute to the global dialogue on UHC through consultations carried out by the Core Action Group. Members of the Consultative Group will receive news and information about the group's activities and will be invited to join meetings and conferences relevant to their expertise by UHC2030 and its partners. Through an annual to biennial rotation mechanisms, members of the Consultative Group can rotate into the Core Action Group.

Core Action Group

Members of the Core Action Group will be invited to participate in hearings and consultation related to UHC2030's work on advocacy, accountability, knowledge management and health systems strengthening coordination for UHC. The Core Action Group is expected to directly provide and coordinate inputs and statements on the private sector perspectives on UHC. This includes serving as the interface with the broader Consultative Group. Further, members can participate in the UHC2030 technical working groups relevant to their expertise. Selected members of the Core Action Group will be invited as observers to the UHC2030 Steering Committee meetings.

When formed, the Core Action Group will also guide the further development of the mandate, governance and funding arrangements of the UHC2030 Private Sector Constituency for the future. The Core Action Group, in close collaboration with UHC2030 Secretariat and the hosting organization of the UHC2030 Private Sector Constituency will set up the annual work plan for the constituency and the organization

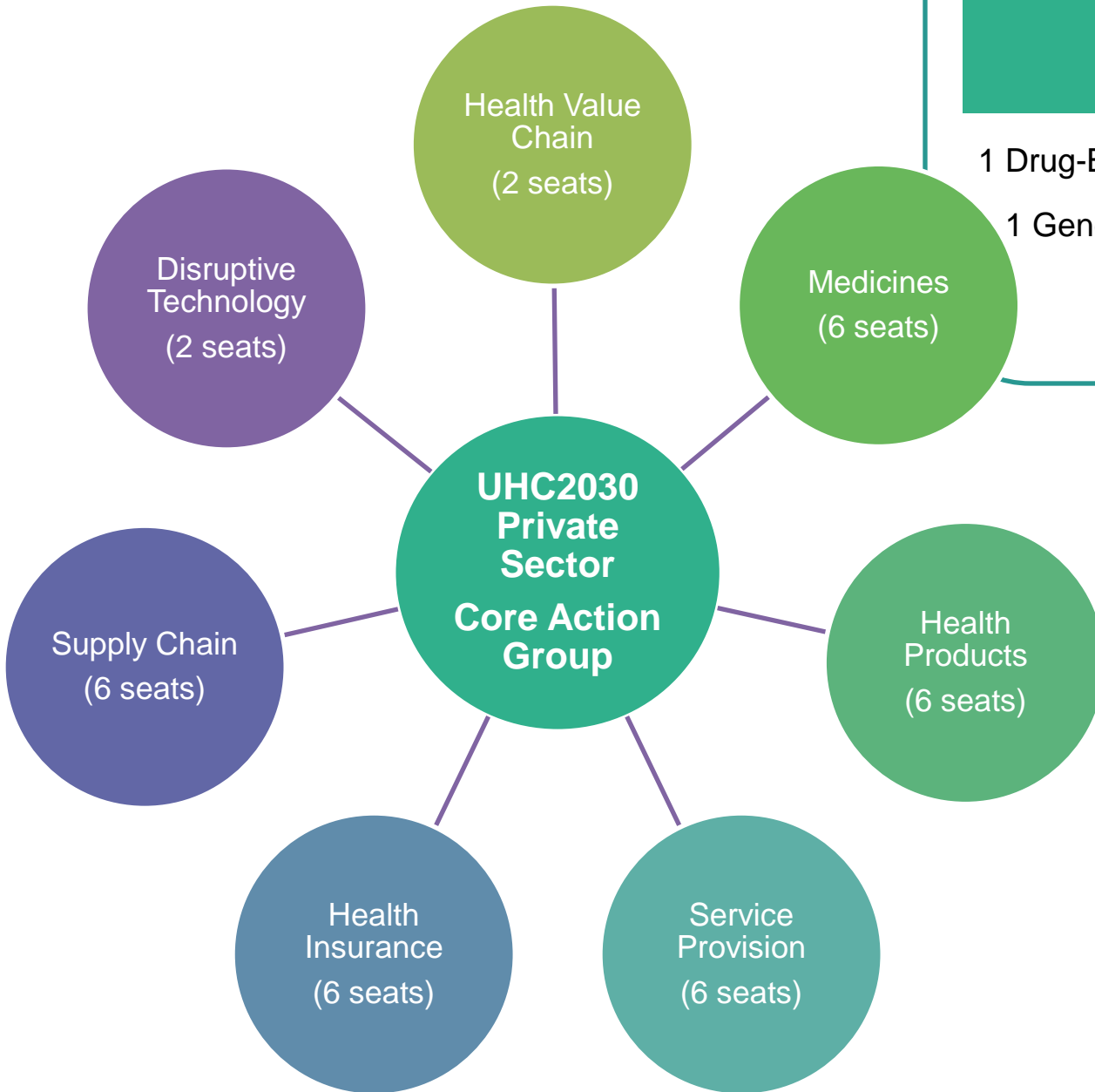
of regular Core Action Group meetings. Members of the Core Action Group are expected to commit significant resources to their engagement including staff time and commit to attend meetings regularly. It is envisaged that members of the Core Action Group will serve a term of 1-2 years and that membership will rotate among other interested partners within the broader Consultative Group.

Core Action Group members need to fulfil the criteria of the UHC2030 Private Sector Constituency and additionally be willing to sign onto the UHC2030 Global Compact to accelerate progress towards UHC. Core Action Group members are also required to publish in their annual reports how they are realizing the principles of the Global Compact. Furthermore, as indicated in the call for expression of interest, statements on the rationale for joining the Core Action Group and vision for contributions will be published on the UHC2030 website.

Members of the Core Action Group are intended to represent the variety of private sector actors working in health. The selection will therefore aim for a balanced geographical and sectoral representation (see graphic below).
